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### **N-SSBA's 62nd Annual Business Meeting**

At the Annual Business Meeting held on May 25, 2022, Nassau-Suffolk School Boards Association honored the critical role played by Long Island's Boards of Education in confronting the challenges presented over the course of intense and unprecedented times.

N-SSBA's President, Michael Kelly, remarked "Who best to recognize the pressures and gravity of the decision making you faced and the value of your contributions other than your colleagues who serve on the Executive Committee of the Nassau-Suffolk School Boards Association?".

In addition to the approval of the annual budget, the slate of officers and executive committee members for the upcoming year were approved. The Association also approved changes to the by-laws.

The Association also recognized the retirements of staff members Vivian Molitor, Office Manager and Lorraine Deller, Executive Director.









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Central Islip's Board President Norman Wagner inducted into The Central Islip Board of Education Hall of Fame.

On May 9, 2022 Norman Wagner was inducted into the Board of Education Hall of Fame at a ceremony prior to a regularly scheduled Board of Education meeting. Mr. Wanger has served the Central Islip community in various leadership roles in addition to the board of education for nearly 40 years. Mr. Wagner also serves on N-SSBA's Executive Committee.

### Offshore Wind Energy Coming to Long Island

N-SSBA recently attended two important roundtable discussions about the new industry coming to Long Island, Offshore Wind. There are two developments already underway on the east end of Long Island with two more planned for the western part of Long Island near Jones Beach. This renewable energy source is a top priority for the State of New York and is providing the Long Island region with a unique opportunity of bringing a brand new industry to our region. By 2030, it is estimated that 70% of the energy needs in New York will be provided with reusable energy. NYS has a goal that by 2040 all energy needs will be electric and carbon free.

This will provide the need for workforce and on-going maintenance of operations for the wind farms that will be built. \$500 million has been allocated for OSW by NYS in this year's approved budget. It is estimated that this industry will create ten new jobs for every one energy sector job lost during the transition to renewable energy.

The two projects currently underway are the Sunrise and Southfork Wind Farms. The two companies that are developing the windfarms out east are Ørsted and Eversource. They both have extensive experience in this industry globally. In addition to workforce needs, there will be opportunities for school districts to collaborate with programming for the classrooms on all levels. It could also impact CTE offerings on Long Island as well.

N-SSBA will continue to attend and play an active role in these meetings and discussions and update you as these projects move forward.

### N-SSBA Co-Hosts School Funding Summit

On Friday, May 6, 2022, N-SSBA co-hosted a School Funding Summit together with the Rural School Boards Association. It was held at the Western Suffolk BOCES Conference Center and was a full day event. The attendees included school board members, superintendents, business officials and other educational leaders from Nassau and Suffolk Counties.

The guest speakers were NYS Senator Shelly Mayer who chairs the Senate Education Committee, Michael Rebell, Executive Director of Campaign for Educational Equity at Teacher's College, Christina Coughlin, Assistant Commissioner from the NYS Education Department, and Dr. Julie Lutz, COO of Eastern Suffolk BOCES.

The conversation focused on what happens after the Foundation Aid Formula is fully funded as promised after next year and the concerns surrounding so many districts being on save harmless. The areas covered by the various speakers included; updating data used for the formula, changing demographics on Long Island, long term economic impact, sustainability, and holding to the constitutional responsibility of a sound basic education for all students in New York State. It was noted by Senator Mayer that this was the first discussion of this nature in NY that she was aware of and was appreciative of the opportunity to share her thoughts on the subject.

The program concluded with a panel discussion with Dave Little, Executive Director of the Rural School Boards Association, Brian Cechnicki, Executive Director of ASBO NY, and Brian Fessler, Director of Governmental Relations for NYSSBA.



## N-SSBA Attends Meeting with Top Law Enforcement Officials from Suffolk County

N-SSBA recently attended a meeting hosted by the Long Island Association with Suffolk County's District Attorney, Sherriff, and Police Commissioner. Mr. Matt Cohen, CEO and President of the LIA, opened the meeting stressing why public safety is an advocacy priority for this business association. "Public Safety is an economic development issue" Mr. Cohen said. County Executive Bellone said "Public safety is a pre-requisite to prosperity".



Sherriff Toulon discussed how he implemented the Sandy Hook Promise initiative and prior to the shut down from COVID was visiting one to two schools per week. He said he'd rather get to the kids first before they get to him in the county jails. Police Commissioner Harrison said his driving philosophy is being a "victims advocate" and is a strong supporter of neighborhood policing. District Attorney Tierney said his office is committed to prosecuting gang, gun, and drug violence vigorously, and is establishing a Criminals Enterprise Investigations Unit to prosecute gang members more effectively.

#### Sayville Board of Education Recognizes Norm deVenau For 18 Years of Service

On June 9, 2022 the Sayville Board of Education celebrated the 18 years of service to the Board of Education by Norm deVenau. He was also recognized for his over 40 years of service to the Sayville community. Norm was also an active board member attending events in Albany.
